

Yellowstone Square Dance Council News

The Yellowstone Square Dance Council met on January 11 at 5 p.m. Among the items discussed were insurance, upcoming special dances and returning to the use of cards to ensure that squares mix and mingle.

It was reported that we received a compliment from Pastor Dave to the effect that they can hardly tell that our dancers have been in the facility. They appreciate that we're careful to leave the place the way we found it.

We were reminded to publicize and encourage dancers to attend the numerous special spring and summer dances in Billings, in Montana and beyond.

According to the Bylaws of the YSDC, officers will serve two-year terms. That means this year is election year. Thought you were done with that, huh? You'll find descriptions of the offices below. The elections will be held at the next YSDC meeting, date yet to be determined. The description of the duties of the elected officers follows:

PRESIDENT - shall preside at all meetings of YSDC and have in mind at all times the best interest of YSDC. The President shall call special meetings at the request of two thirds of the delegates. The President will automatically be an exofficio member of all committees.

VICE PRESIDENT - shall perform the duties of the President in the event of the President's absence.

SECRETARY - shall keep a record of all proceedings of YSDC, shall act as YSDC Correspondent in matters pertaining to the business of YSDC, and shall keep a correct enrollment of all member clubs

TREASURER shall receive and take care of all monies belonging to YSDC and shall disburse it at the order of YSDC. The Treasurer shall keep an accurate report of all receipts and expenditures. *(Editor's note: current treasurer Terry Drange gives a more detailed description of this office in "Help Wanted" on page 2 of this month's Grapevine.)*

The YSDC is directed to meet a minimum of three times per year (September through May). Unless a major event is upcoming, such as hosting a state festival or finding a new dance location, neither of which is anticipated to happen soon, there's rarely a reason to have more than three meetings.

Request a check from the Treasurer to pay for the USDA dancer insurance as needed.

The website: www.usda.org has all the information regarding insurance under "Programs."

Elizabeth Sanders is the USDA Insurance Coordinator, she is very knowledgeable and helpful.

Keep in contact with the club leaders as to the member status of the clubs.

Print Current Rosters and distribute to clubs and copy to the white 3 ring binder (Binder is with the AED device at 1st Presbyterian Church.

Keep current Excel list: "All YSDC Dancers and Clubs They Paid Membership At"

Receive and disburse Council monies. (Dues, Special Dances, Financial Obligations)

Keep Western Security Check Book in balance. (Council President and Vice President are also authorized signers)

File IRS Form 990-N (e-Postcard) by April 15 (IRS on line form)

File Annual Report with MT Secretary of State by April 15 (MT Sec. of State on line form)


